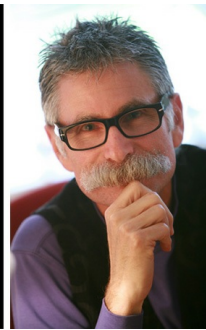
March is Women's History Month, and [this e-resource](#) is a treasure trove of primary and secondary documents across 400 years of American and women's history.

All Pub Nights are free and open to everyone - not just faculty! Pub refreshments and snacks will be served, and copies of Wenner's book will be available for sale and signing.

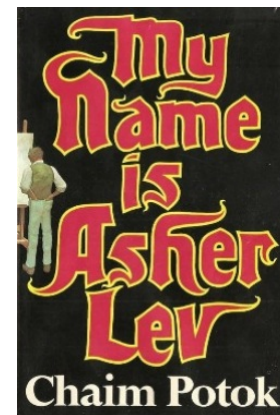

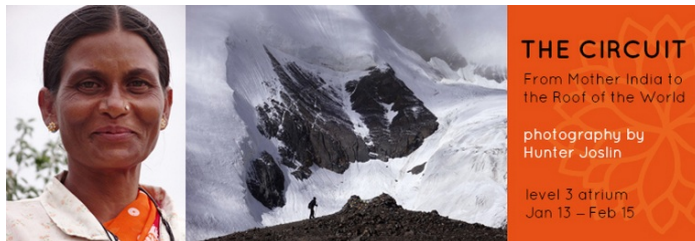
