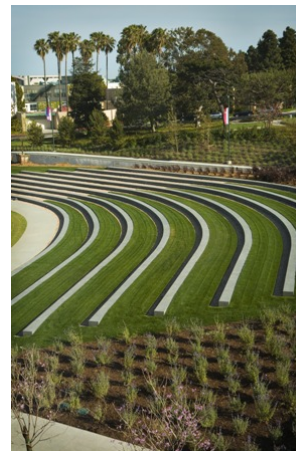

## Pub Night: Restoring the Ballona Wetlands, Improving Water Quality

You are invited to the fourth and final evening in the library's spring [Pub Night](#) lineup.



Natural Science Professor John Dorsey has been engaged in water quality research within the lower Ballona Creek Watershed, including studies within Ballona Wetlands, Estuary and Creek, and in Del Rey Lagoon. In the final Pub Night presentation of the year, he will describe how his studies have demonstrated the ability of wetland process to cleanse contaminated water entering from the Ballona Creek/Estuary system, and how he's predicting that planned restoration actions could further enhance the quality of water flowing to adjacent recreational beaches in Santa Monica Bay.

## Lorna Dee Cervantes: The Poetry of Improbability



A fifth generation Californian of Mexican and Native American (Chumash) heritage, Lorna Dee Cervantes is an internationally acclaimed poet and was a pivotal figure throughout the Chicano literary movement. Her poetry has appeared in well over 200 anthologies and textbooks. She is the recipient of many honors, and literary fellowships including: the American Book Award, the Paterson Prize for Poetry, the Latino Literature Award, the International Latino Book award, and a nomination for the Pulitzer Prize for Poetry.

At this special event, fully titled *The Poetry of Improbability: Art, Activism, and Beauty*, Ms. Cervantes will be reading and discussing her work and signing books.

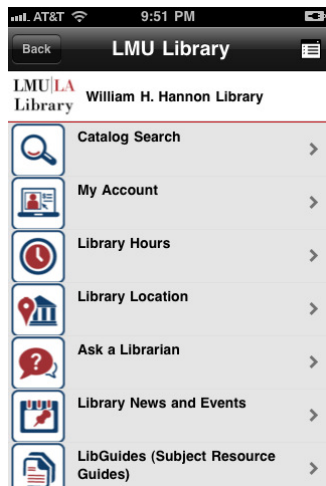
