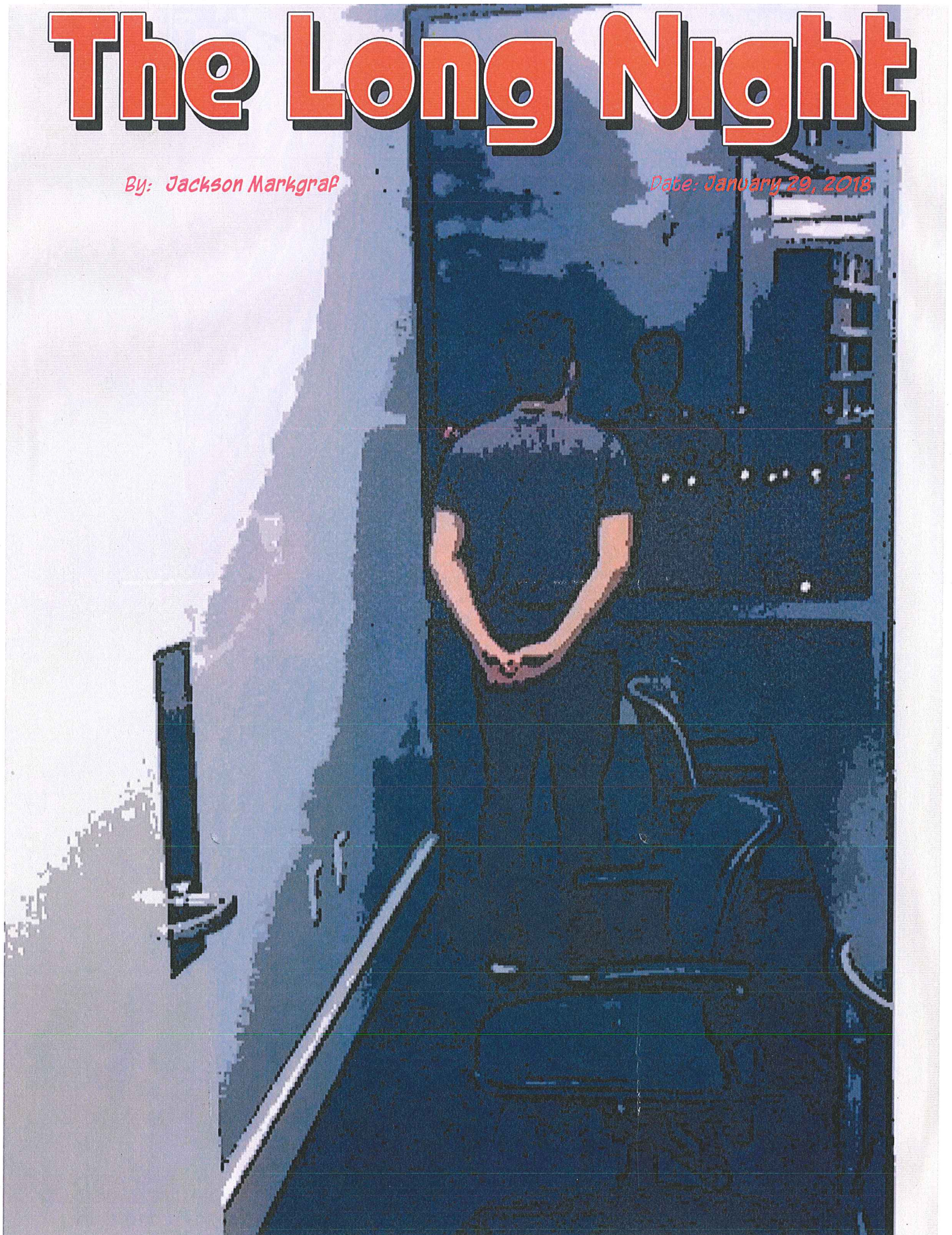

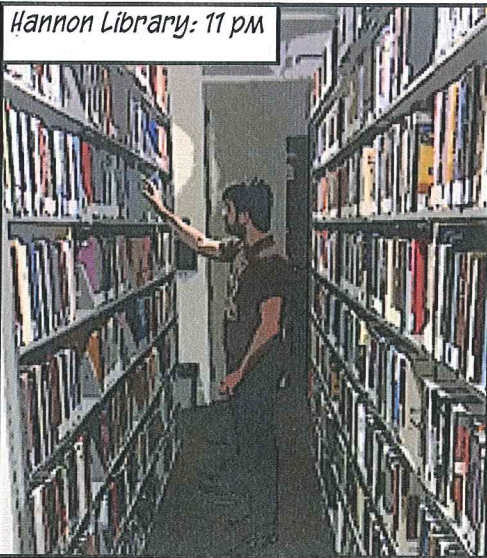
The Long Night

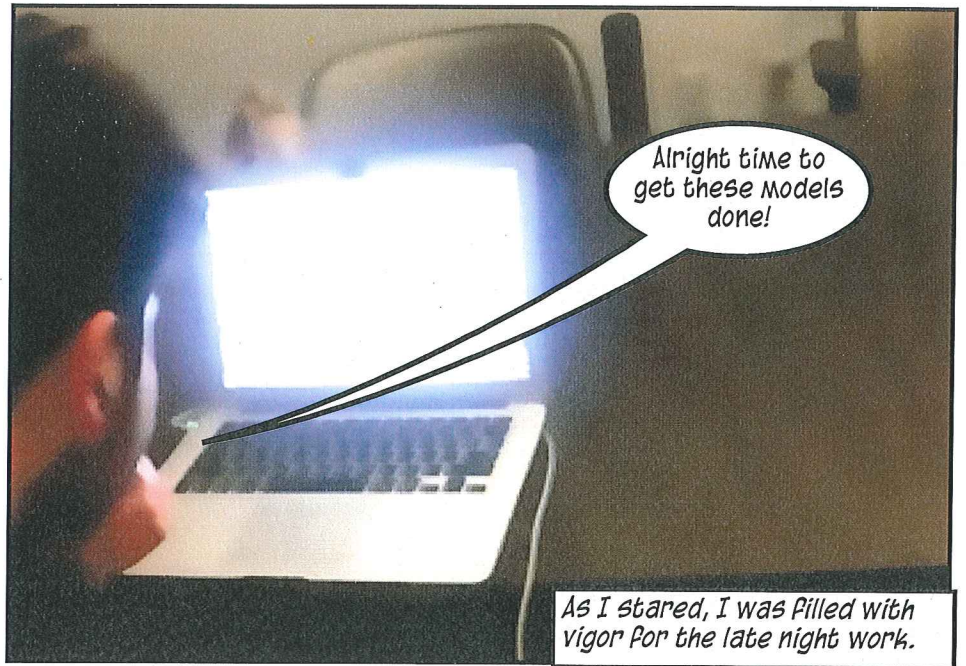

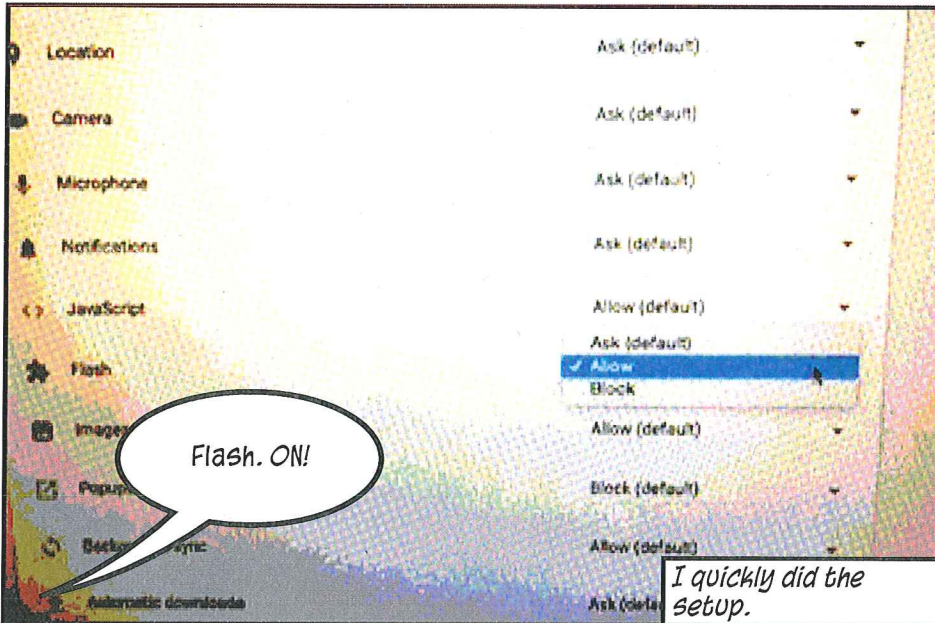
Hannon Library: 11 pm



I arrived in the library, ready to complete my Information Literacy Modules.

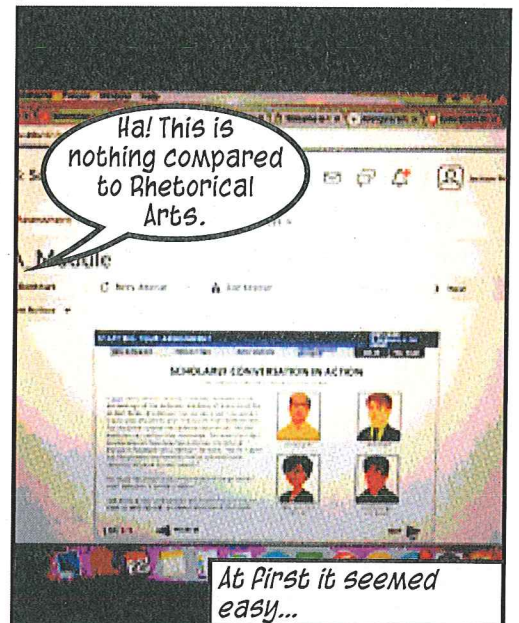


As I stared, I was Filled with vigor for the late night work.



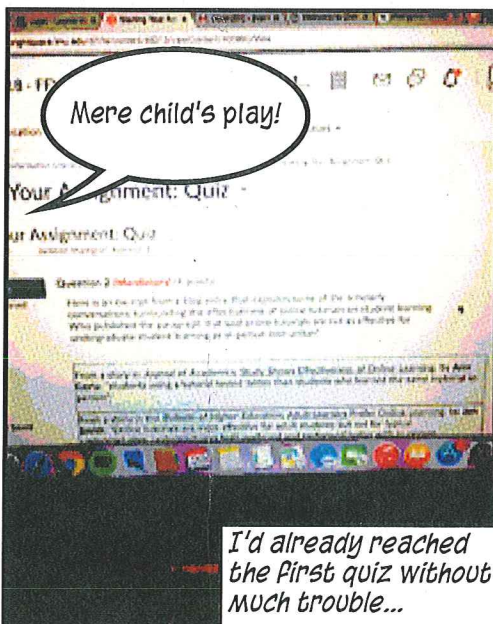
Flash. ON!

I quickly did the setup.



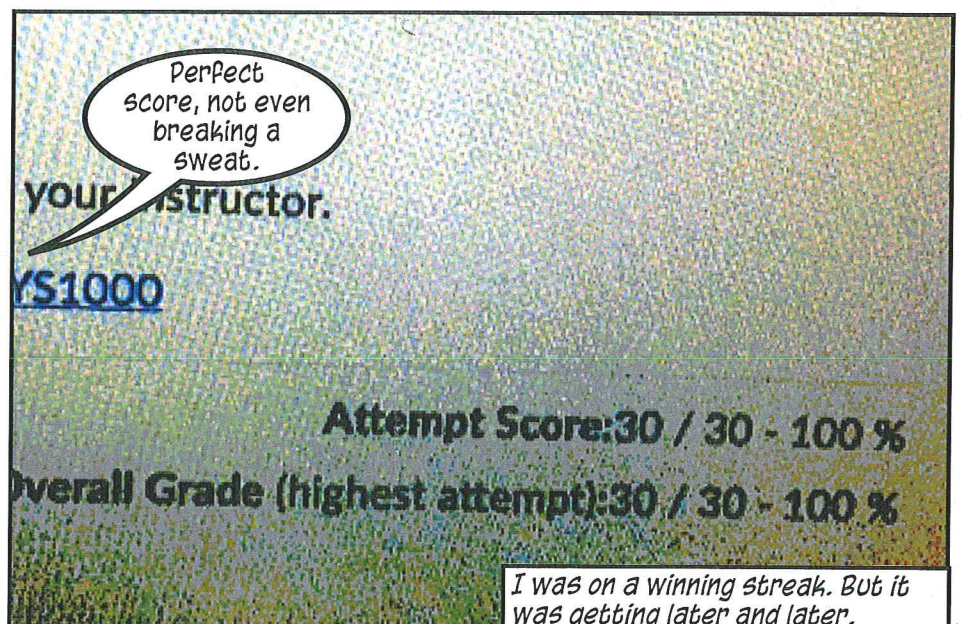
Ha! This is nothing compared to Rhetorical Arts.

You gotta be kidding me. I know types of information like the back of my hand!

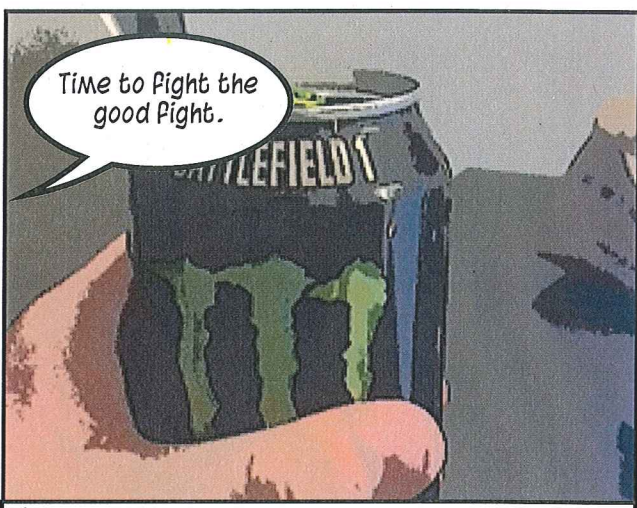

The last part of the call number, if your book has it, is also read alphabetically then numerically. For example, 006.15 11123 is after 006.15 025 and before 006.15

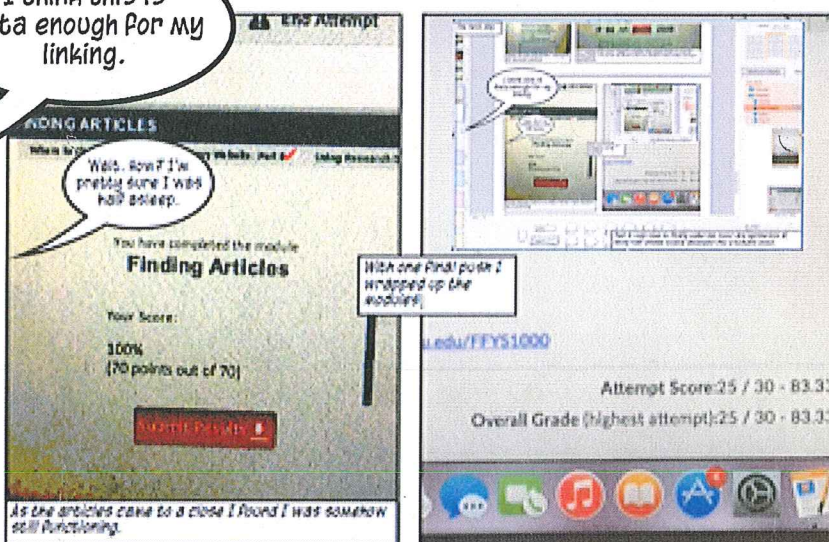
As I reached this point I began to realize why people prefer to look for books online. Of course at almost 2:30 am numbers were pretty taxing in my defense.
