Voices of the Civil War Speak at LMU

All semester long, the William H. Hannon Library is host to a **series of exhibitions and events** commemorating the sesquicentennial of the ending of the Civil War.

The 2015 series kicks off on Thursday February 5 at 6 p.m. with the opening program and reception for the Archives and Special Collections exhibition *Not Silent: Finding Voices in Civil War Artifacts*.

The opening features a keynote by historian Dr. Ronald C. White, Jr., "The Voice of Abraham Lincoln: The Second Inaugural Address."

Dr. White will explore Lincoln's voice, the role of oratory in the nineteenth century, and the value of words then and now.

The program - which is free and open to the public - is followed by a hosted reception and exhibition viewing, accompanied by a performance of Civil War era violin music.

One night in 1971, eight ordinary Americans stole every single file from an FBI office near Philadelphia, PA. The burglary uncovered evidence that was the beginning of the end of the mythical FBI the bureau's director, J. Edgar Hoover, had constructed in the American mind over nearly a half century.

For over forty years, the identity of the burglars was unknown, despite being the subjects of one of the lengthiest FBI

investigations in history. Ultimately their actions forced Congress - long intimidated by Hoover - to acknowledge the FBI director's illegal and damaging influence.

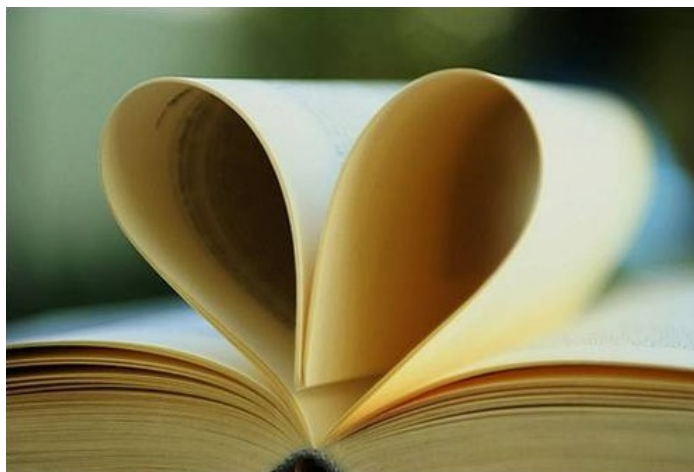

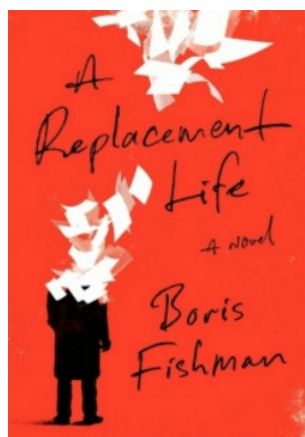

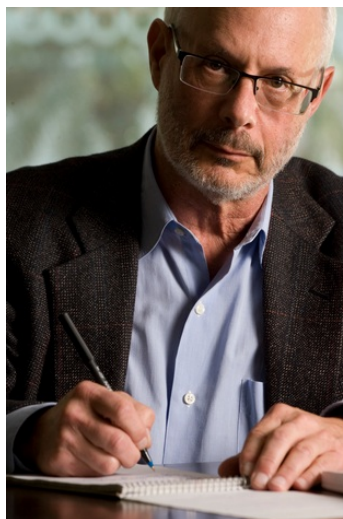
Join Hannon Library and Jewish Studies for an author talk and book signing with the talented **Boris Fishman**, author of *A Replacement Life*.
