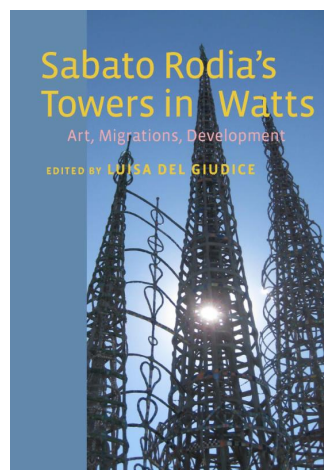

Most books are priced at \$5 hardback / \$3 paperback.

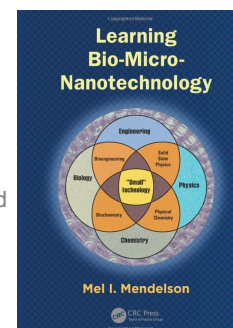

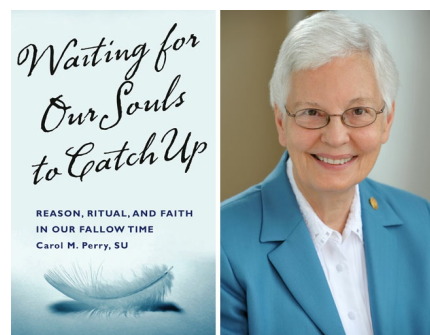
