Epistemic Disobedience

Delinking from Western philosophy and systems

INSTITUTIONAL DEIA

Lacks consideration of power dynamics

Emphasis on self reflection with vague notions of accountability

Elitist and academic language

Evaluation models too broad & undefined

Becomes a checklist or goalpost towards mastery. Mastery of what?

LIS BORDER THINKING FRAMEWORK

- Awareness of colonization & injustice
- Recognizes the body as a site of knowledge
- Rooted in community and emerges from the margins
- Resists classification
- Continuous unlearning via process of delinking
