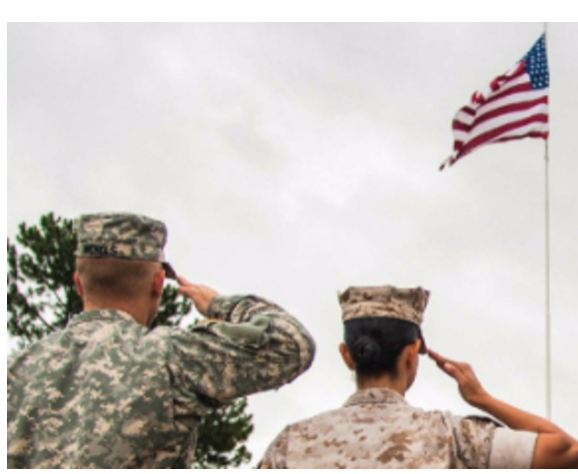
Haunting of Hannon V

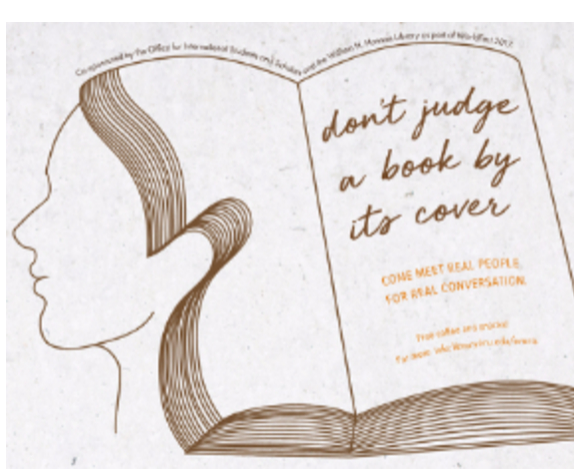


Veterans Library Exhibit Reception

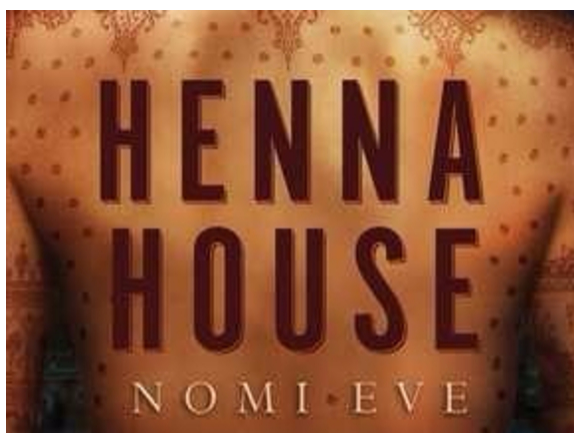


Faculty Pub Night: Greg Ruzzin
