## ESSAY CONTEST ON CONSTITUTION WILL AWARD \$10,000

West Publishing Co., in cooperation with the Commission on the Bicentennial of the United States Constitution, has announced sponsorship of an essay competition for law school students.

First prize will be \$10,000, second \$2,500, and third \$1,000. Each regional winner will receive a three volume set of Treatise on Constitution Law: Substance and Procedure, published by West. All cash prizes will also be furnished by West.

The competition is open to all students enrolled in a J.D. or LL.B. degree program in an ABA or state-approved law school. The subject for the essay is:

**"Does the allocation of power between the federal and state governments and among the branches of the federal government contribute to the preservation of individual liberty and the functioning of our government?"**

All entries must be postmarked by April 15, 1987, and should consist of no more than 5,000 words, including footnotes. Complete rules, as well as entry forms, are available from: Education Program, Commission on the Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution, 736 Jackson Place, N.W., Washington, DC 20503.

All entries must be submitted to the Clerk of Court, United States Court of Appeals for the Ninth Circuit, Post Office Box 547 San Francisco, CA 94101. Regional judging will be by a panel of judges approved by the members of the national judging committee. All regional winners will advance to the national level. Winners will be announced in September, 1987.

## CPR LEGAL PROGRAM AWARD

The Center for Public Resources has created an award program which includes an award for outstanding student scholarship on alternative dispute resolution, dispute prevention, and litigation management techniques. First prize is \$2,000, second prize is \$1,000. Entries must be received on or before December 15, 1986. They should be an article, book or other manuscript, together with a brief cover letter. #### JESUIT SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE

The conditions of this award are as follows:

1. 2nd, 3rd and 4th year students in either Day or Evening Division are eligible.
2. The student must have a GPA of 80 or more at the time of the award.
3. The student must be in need of financial assistance.
4. The student, as an undergraduate, must have attended Loyola Marymount University or some other Jesuit College.
5. Each student should manifest his or her practical concern for Christian religion and moral values in the practice of law. This must be articulated in writing, as this is your application.

Any student who meets the above conditions is eligible to apply. Immediate action is required. Deadline for applications has been extended to Wednesday, October 8, 1986. Bring your essay as denoted in #5 above to the Financial Aid Office.
