Library Instruction at LMU 2017-2018

At the William H. Hannon Library, we provide a variety of instructional services aimed at helping students locate, access, and evaluate a diverse array of sources. The sessions we offer include both general and discipline-specific information literacy instruction, digital scholarship work, and Archives and Special Collections instruction. This past academic year, LMU librarians taught more than 300 classes, which included 5,528 undergraduate and graduate students across 21 disciplines.

These sessions, which are often developed in collaboration with our faculty, support the goal of LMU's Core Curriculum to teach students how to "identify information needs, locate and access relevant information, and critically evaluate a diverse array of sources." With the support of librarians, every first-year at LMU begins developing basic information literacy skills in their First-Year Seminar and Rhetorical Arts courses. This initial work provides a foundation for more advanced library instruction in upper-level courses flagged for information literacy.

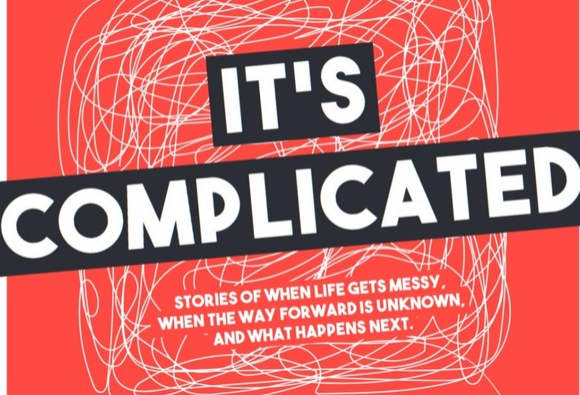

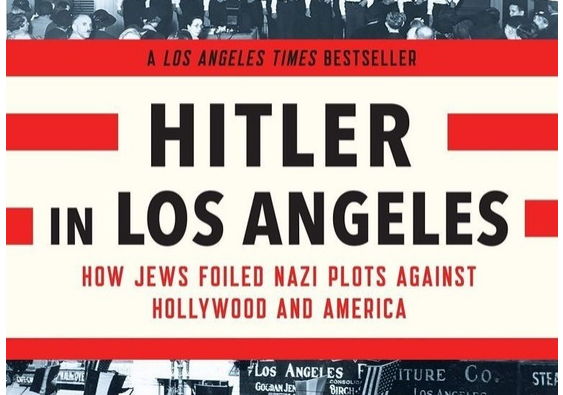


LMU Speaks: It's Complicated

March 5, 5:00-7:30p

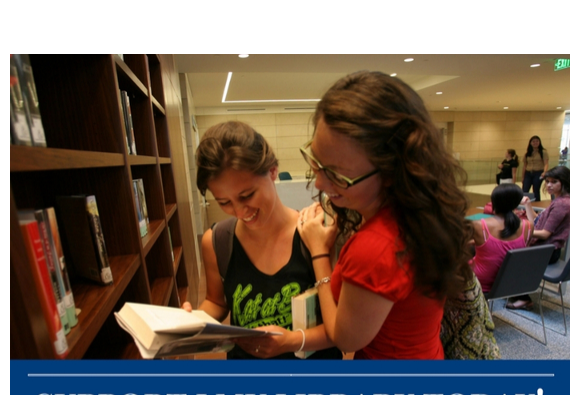
