## TUITION NOTICE

Beginning with the Fall 1986 semester, a flat tuition rate was initiated for full-time and part-time students entering as first year students; only those advanced students who entered prior to Fall 1986 are to continue to pay tuition on a per unit basis, with this plan being phased out as they graduate. To clarify, current first and incoming students (August 1987) pay a flat fee, and will continue to do so as will all future students; next year's (1987-1988) third, fourth and fifth year students will continue to pay on a per unit basis.
