The gates will be opened at 3:30 p.m.

ALUMNI AND VISITORS

Alumni and visitors to Loyola Law School will be welcomed, however advance notification must be given to Entrance Supervisor so that authorized and expected visitors will be admitted.

All people expecting guests should notify the School Receptionist as early as possible (preferably 24 hours in advance) so a list may be prepared and the guests welcomed.

Unscheduled alumni or visitors who visit will be directed (during the day) to the Union Street Parking Garage and be expected to pay the daily charge.

DECALS - ISSUING

Two and/or more parking lot decals will be issued to a purchaser. All pertinent individual details (model, year, etc.) will still be required.

EVENING STUDENTS PARKING

- A) Day Parking: Students with evening parking permits (Columbia Street after 5 p.m.) who have day classes will be permitted to park in the Columbia lot up to a capacity of 20 vehicles. If 20 is ever surpassed the drivers will be directed to the Union Garage at no charge.
- B) Evening Moving of Cars Between

 Lots: After 7 p.m. access to Union Street
 parkers and others will be given to the
 Columbia lot after 7 p.m. or Albany Street
 Garage after 8 p.m. Access to the Albany
 Garage may be limited because of special
 events.

CARS LEFT OVERNIGHT

- A) Those in the Albany Garage will be ticketed if prior approval has not been granted or they are not moved by 8 a.m. the day following.
- B) In the Columbia lot, improperly marked cars must be moved by 8 a.m. or ticketed. It is important to note cars left in this lot after 11:30 p.m. each night will be locked in until the following morning at 7 a.m. Should a vehicle be there after 11:30

p.m. on a Friday night it will not be able to be retrieved until 7 a.m. the following Monday morning. There is also no protection services during this same Friday night to Monday morning period.

NOTICE REGARDING SUBMISSION OF RESUMES TO FALL OCI EMPLOYERS:

Please be advised that if resumes submitted for the Fall On-Campus Interview Program are found to be in violation of the policies regarding display of grade/rank/G.P.A., students must correct resumes immediately.

In order to submit resumes for remaining employers students must submit corrected resumes to the Career Planning and Placement Center: 10 copies to student file and one to each employer envelope which contains an incorrect resume. Students must notify Center staff when they submit corrected resumes.

After Friday, September 11, resumes which do not conform to policy will be pulled and students will be suspended from resume submission until the grade information has been corrected.

RECONSIDERATION FOR GUARANTEED STUDENT LOAN ELIGIBILITY

One of the most significant changes to the Guaranteed Student Loan Program resulting from the Higher Education Amendments of 1986 is the requirement that all students demonstrate financial need in order to qualify for a Guaranteed Student Loan (GSL). As most GSL applicants are aware, in order to determine GSL eligibility, the Financial Aid Office must use a need analysis system which has been approved by the U.S. Secretary of Education.

The impact of this need analysis system on GSL eligibility has been considerable, especially affecting many of Loyola's single and married independent students who fall within the thirty-five percent (35%) or greater income tax bracket. These students were eligible for GSL's in 1986-1987, but because of the change they are now ineligible this 1987-1988 academic year.

In an attempt to alleviate the hardship this may pose, those students who fall within the above-noted tax bracket may appeal their awards. However, students must realize that the parameters within which the Financial Aid Office can reevaluate are very limited and specific. Therefore, students must be able to demonstrate, within accepted guidelines, that the expected family contribution indicated on their award letters does not accurately account for the expected available cash flow required to contribute to their expected educational expenses. To do this, the student must provide, in writing, the following documentation with an explanation:

-Copies of the student's two most recent family income pay stubs (e.g., student and spouse).

-Verification from employer of all deductions withheld from monthly gross income, if not noted on pay stubs. This must include taxes and insurance premiums.

-Verification of termination of employment, if applicable.

-Official estimates of medical, dental, pharmaceutical, child care, and/or car repair expenses expected to be incurred during the school year. All verification must be furnished by the person providing the services.

Due to the considerable amount of staff resources that will be required to analyze the appeals, it is anticipated that appeals submitted to the Financial Aid Office will take a minimum of 35 working days for review. Students will be notified in writing as to whether or not the new information will affect their GSL eligibility.
