Scott Moot Court Competition

The Scott Moot Court competition final oral arguments are scheduled for Tuesday, April 12 from 7:30 - 9:00 p.m. in the Moot Court Room.

The six finalists in the 1988 Scott Moot Court competition will argue the issue of whether the Independent Counsel provisions of the Ethics in Government Act are constitutional. The arguments will be held before an exceptional bench consisting of: Hon. Stanley Mosk - Associate Justice, Supreme Court of California; Hon. Otto M. Kaus - retired Associate Justice, Supreme Court of California, and Hon. Alex Kozinski - Circuit Judge for the United States Court of Appeals, Ninth Circuit.

The issues to be argued closely parallel those in the case of Morrison v. Olson, which the Supreme Court will hear later this month. The timeliness and constitutional significance of these issues are sure to make the final oral arguments an exciting event. All students are encouraged to attend this event and see Loyola's finest oral advocates argue before this prestigious bench.
