Why is it important to Identify and Prepare Resources?

- 1. If you don't have your resources identified and lined up you may not be able to implement your Vision.
- 2. Resources are necessary to put in any kind of garden, they must be secured ahead of time, and they might become available in stages.
- 3. Once you have your resources identified you can start laying out a plan based on their availability, and prepare for their utilization.
- 4. If you don't have everything identified and lined up before you start you may not be able to get the resources when needed.
