Long-Term Garden Maintenance Research

Lesson Purpose: To conduct research on various aspects of maintaining a garden for a long-term duration, to ensure a successful garden year-round. The research conducted will include students in each group making recommendations on their assigned topic to the whole class, during the whole-group share-out in Activity 3. This research is critical to informing the class on how to proceed with the Master Garden Maintenance Checklist which will be created in Activity 4.

Research Resources: In addition to searching content-specific internet sites, student can access the articles in the "Reading Materials" section of the Module 10 resources. There are some great articles, including one titled:

Research Topics:

- Reviewing Existing Garden Maintenance Processes (established in Lesson 7)
 - 3 Ws: Walking, weeding, watering
 - Thinning vegetables
 - Protecting plants from inclement weather
 - Harvesting processes & timeline
 - Distributing produce
 - Flower care
