Contreras et al. v. El Salvador

I. COMPLIANCE AND FOLLOW-UP ADDENDUM¹

September 1, 2016: The Court found that the State complied with the following five reparation measures: first, restoration of Mr. Serapio Cristian's and Mr. Rubén Rivera's identities as well as family reunification and therapy if they were willing; second, correct identification of the Guatemalan victim - Ms. Gregoria Herminia Contrera; third, publication of the Judgment with circulation to the State's military; fourth, dedication of three schools after the victims; fifth, payment of the pecuniary and non-pecuniary damages to all but three individuals. The Court found that the State must continue to provide medical and psychiatric treatment to the victims.

The Court additionally found that the State failed to fully comply with the remaining reparations,⁴ including paying damages to the remaining victims; reimbursing the Center for Justice and International Law (Centro Por La Justicia y El Derecho Internacional; "CEJIL")'s expenses; identifying and prosecuting the responsible parties; locating the victims' whereabouts; guaranteeing safe return of Ms. Gregoria Herminia Contrera; creating a documentary about the case and forced disappearances during the civil war; and adopting appropriate measures to ensure the proper investigation of human rights violations.⁵ The Court requested that the State report on its compliance with the remaining reparations no later than January 20, 2017.⁶
